Dear Girls State Citizen,

Enclosed are the rules and an application for the Paul Powell Scholarship offered by American Legion Auxiliary Illini Girls State. The money for this scholarship comes from a trust fund set up by former Illinois Secretary of State, Paul Powell. We are grateful to him for designating IGS as a recipient of a portion of his estate.

We will be awarding only one (1) scholarship, but suggest it is worth your consideration. The application will be judged and the winner notified and announced at the annual Department (State) Convention of the American Legion Auxiliary in July.

If you are interested in applying, please read the rules carefully and complete Part I of the application before you arrive at IGS. **Part II is to be completed at IGS and turned in to your Counselor during City meeting on Thursday evening at IGS.** Take a few minutes to complete the form. You may be the winner!

Should you need more space to completely answer the question, feel free to use the back side.

RULES:

1. Applicant must:
 - a. Attend a FULL WEEK at American Legion Auxiliary Illini Girls State.
 - b. Plan to further her education beyond High School by attending a Technical School, Junior College, College, or University.
2. The scholarship payment will be made by American Legion Auxiliary Illini Girls State upon confirmation of recipient's enrollment in the school of her choice. The recipient has three years from the date of her selection to claim the scholarship. If the scholarship is not claimed within three years, then it will be forfeited.
3. The recipient will be required to sign an agreement stating that if she does not complete her first semester at the school of enrollment, the entire amount of the scholarship must be returned to the American Legion Auxiliary within thirty days of withdrawal.
